Picture Description¹⁾

A close-up shows two Stolpersteine (stumbling stones) embedded in a cobblestone street, commemorating victims of Nazi persecution.

Analysis¹⁾

This photograph captures a somber yet poignant scene: two "Stolpersteine" (stumbling stones) set into a cobblestone street. These small, brass memorials commemorate Karl Bukofzer and Alfred Koh, victims of the Holocaust. The stones are flush with the surrounding cobblestones, their golden surfaces stark against the grey stones. Engraved upon each plaque are the words "Hier Wohnte" (Here Lived), followed by the person's name, birthdate, date of deportation, and place of extermination. Karl Bukofzer was deported to Riga and murdered on September 8, 1942, while Alfred Koh was deported to Auschwitz and murdered on March 6, 1943. The photograph serves as a powerful reminder of the lives lost during the Holocaust and a call to remember and never forget.
